ITINERARY

Day 1 Depart South Wales travelling to Brighton.
Day 2 A day at leisure. Brighton and Hove has everything you could want - a royal palace, elegant Regency architecture, museums, laid-back beach life and superb shopping. The Royal Pavilion, home of King George IV, is probably the most exotic, extravagant royal palace in Europe. Stroll along the Victorian Pier and the beachfront, where stylish bars and cafés spill out onto the curved paving. For shopping, try the Lanes, smart and chic, and the bohemian North Lane, both good for antiques and designer clothes.
Day 3 Situated high above the valley of the River Ouse, the little Saxon town of Lewes boasts one of the best preserved castle Barbican's in England. We include a visit to Anne of Cleves House, a 15th century timber-framed Wealden house that formed part of Anne's divorce settlement from Henry VIII

in 1541. The house contains wide-ranging collections of Sussex interest with bedroom and kitchen furnished to reflect an earlier period. (Not suitable for people with walking difficulties).

Day 4 Today we travel to Kingscote Station and board the Bluebell Line steam train to Sheffield Park Station. The Bluebell Railway was the first preserved standard gauge passenger line in the world, everything here has a wonderfully genuine feel of the past, from the period carriages to the splendid stations decked out with nostalgic advertisements. Sheffield Park Gardens are an internationally renowned landscape garden containing many thousands of mature trees and shrubs planted for their visual effect with its centerpiece featuring the original four lakes linked by cascades and waterfalls.
