A full day excursion visiting the seaside resorts of Seaton and Lyme Regis. Seaton has a mile long pebble beach at the mouth of the River Axe. We include a scenic tram journey along the beautiful Axe valley, enjoying panoramic views, to the ancient town of Colyton. Finally we arrive in Lyme Regis a historic seaside resort and fishing port on the world famous Cobb harbour.

Today we visit Exeter, a cathedral city brimming with colourful character and offering a delightful mix of high quality attractions, restaurants and shops in a setting of architectural splendour. We then continue to the picturesque village of

Topsham for an afternoon cruise down the river Exe to Exmouth. Hot beverage will be served on board.* Times depend on tidal restrictions.

A half day excursion to Dawlish and Teignmouth. The Victorian town of Dawlish has decorative flower beds and the Dawlish brook that runs through the town is home to the famous black swans. Teignmouth is an historic port on the mouth of the Teign estuary. It has all the attractions of a seaside town, including a Victorian pier and a thriving mixture of shopping areas and interesting back streets.
