Day 3 A half day excursion to Wroxham, considered the capital of the Norfolk Broads and where boating holidays started in the late 1800's. We include a boat trip where you can relax and enjoy the commentary as you cruise the beautiful Norfolk Broads on board a luxury double-decker passenger boat.

Day 4 A full day excursion of the north Norfolk coast. We visit Cromer before returning via Thursford and the fascinating Thursford organ Museum. The streets of Cromer today are little removed from how they looked in the Victorian era. Most of the great landmarks, many of which were created by the well-to-do Victorian "summer timers", still stand as familiar to the holiday makers of today as they were to their counterparts a hundred years ago. Thursford museum in the tranquil setting of a small Norfolk village takes you back to a traditional old-fashioned fairground where majestic engines sit next to carousel rides. The daily musical shows with Robert Wolfe at the Wurlitzer Cinema organ not only brings you music from today but also takes you back to the days of the silent movie using today's technology.

Day 5 Half day tour to Lowestoft.

Day 6 Return to South Wales.

Jane Austen's House

Jane Austen Country & the Watercress Line

The novelist Jane Austen is known worldwide for her popular novels describing the society of pre-industrial England.

Hampshire offers a wealth of treasures, from rolling countryside, glorious gardens and pretty villages to bustling market towns.

ITINERARY

Day 1 We depart South Wales travelling to the magnificent Blenheim Palace, a baroque masterpiece and birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill. The Palace is set in 2100 acres of spectacular parkland landscaped by Capability Brown and surrounding by sweeping lawns and formal gardens. We complete the journey to the hotel arriving with time to relax before dinner.

Day 2 A full day visiting Winchester and Salisbury. Winchester, England's ancient capital is steeped in history and packed with historic buildings. From legend and lore to awe inspiring architecture Winchester is a treasure trove of English heritage. We continue to the magnificent medieval city of Salisbury with its historic streets and alleyways, charming half-timbered buildings, traditional English eating houses and character shopping streets, not to mention the UK's finest medieval cathedral. We return via Stonehenge, now designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

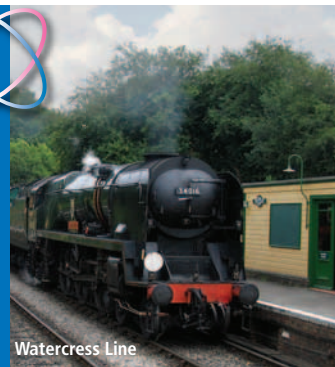
Day 3 We travel to the pretty Georgian town of New Alresford where we board the popular 'Watercress Line' enjoying a scenic journey through 10 miles of beautiful Hampshire countryside, through the restful open spaces and famous topiary at Ropley, then up the steep climb to the picturesque country station at Medstead and Four Marks, the highest station in the South of England, and then down into the busy market town of Alton - each station has a distinct character that is a delight to explore. We then visit the home of Jane Austen. She spent the last eight years of her life at Chawton in the 17th century house which is now preserved in her memory and where most believe she wrote some of her best work.

Day 4 After a leisurely breakfast we return home via Bath where you can visit the Jane Austen museum if you wish.
