South Yorkshire is full of pleasant surprises with an engaging mix of old and new. The county sat at the heart of the industrial revolution in England, and today, the region's many museums, historic canals, mills and mining, heritage steam railways and striking Victorian architecture are testament to the past.

### ITINERARY

**Day 1** Travelling to Yorkshire.  
**Day 2** We travel to Thwaite Mills where you can experience the power and force of a fully restored working watermill on a guided tour of this fascinating site. Nestled on a tranquil 'island' between the River Aire and the Aire and Calder Navigation, is one of the best last remaining examples of a water-powered mill in Britain. We continue to the nearby Leeds Industrial Museum at Armley Mills. The museum contains exhibits dating from the 18th and 19th centuries that show the history of textiles, clothing and engine and locomotive manufacture in the area. The museum also illustrates the history of cinema projections, including the first moving pictures taken in Leeds, as well as 1920s silent movies.  
**Day 3** We travel to the charming village of Saltaire, founded in 1853 by Sir Titus Salt, a leading industrialist in the Yorkshire woollen industry. The name of the village combines the founder's surname and the name of the pretty river that runs through the village. In December 2001, the village was designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Fast forward to

present day, and Salts Mill now forms the heart of the village. The impressive building is now fully converted and home to an inspiring David Hockney gallery, a superb selection of shops and some tempting restaurants and cafes. We continue to Keighley where we have arranged a single journey on the Keighley and Worth Valley railway, best known for the filming of the 'Railway Children'.  
**Day 4** Today we visit Harewood House. The outstanding home of the Earl of Harewood is renowned for its stunning architecture and exquisite Adam interiors, containing a rich collection of Chippendale furniture, fine porcelain and outstanding art collections. There are over 100 acres of award-winning gardens, designed by Capability Brown, set within rolling parkland surrounding the House and lakeside. We return via the charming historic town of Wetherby, on the banks of the River Wharfe. The town centre is full of interesting small shops selling a wide variety of goods. There are also many tea, coffee shops and restaurants  
**Day 5** Return to South Wales.
