Isles of Arran and Gigha

6 DAY TOURS

The Isle of Arran is one of the most southerly Scottish islands and sits in the Firth of Clyde between Ayrshire and Kintyre and has a remarkable diversity of landscapes and seascapes. The pretty villages on Arran's beautiful coastline are complemented by a rugged and mountainous interior in the north and green rolling hills and woodland in the south.

ITINERARY

Day 1 We travel to Scotland and our overnight's half board accommodation at the Station hotel in Ayr.

Day 2 Today we take the ferry from Ardrossan to Brodick and enjoy a circular tour of the Isle of Arran. Later we catch the ferry from Claonaig to Lochranza of the Mull of Kintyre arriving at the Argyll Hotel in Inveraray in time for evening meal.

Day 3 At leisure in Inveraray. The town is known as the home of the former county courthouse and county prison for Argyll. Completed in 1820 the Courthouse was used by the Sheriff Court and less frequently by the High Court from Edinburgh. The prison closed in 1889 and is now open to the public all year. Inveraray has many easy level walks and numerous shops and tea rooms for visitors to explore.

Day 4 Today we take the ferry to the Isle of Gigha, the most southerly and one of the most beautiful of the Hebridean Islands. Seven miles long by a mile and a half wide, Gigha is simply breathtaking with fine sandy beaches, clear green seas and a host of wildlife.

Day 5 After breakfast we travel to Stirling driving along the shoreline of Loch Lomond through the Trossachs visiting Drymen and Buchlyvie before arriving at our overnight's half board accommodation at the Golden Lion hotel in Stirling.

Day 6 We depart after breakfast and complete the journey home.
