Oban and the Isle of Mull

The sweeping mountains of Lorn create the perfect backdrop to the picturesque bustling port of Oban also known as the unofficial capital of the West Highlands - the "Gateway to the Isles". For centuries the panoramic views of the mountains, lochs and islands have captivated artists, authors, composers, and poets. Mull is the largest of the islands of Argyll and the third largest in Scotland. It has a rich cultural Heritage and some of the most stunning land and seascapes to be found.

ITINERARY

Day 1 Travel to our overnight half board accommodation.

Day 2 We complete the journey to Oban arriving at your chosen hotel with time to relax before dinner.

Day 3 Today we enjoy a leisurely excursion along the shores of the stunning Loch Linnhe to the Highland town of Fort William, in the shadow of mighty Ben Nevis. We include a journey on the Mountain Cable car transporting you up to 650m on the slopes of Aonach Mor, a stone's throw from Ben Nevis.

Day 4 After breakfast we enjoy a fabulous tour to the islands of Mull and Iona. We depart from the ferry terminal in Oban crossing to Craignure on Mull which takes approximately 40 minutes. We join a local coach and driver for a scenic tour across the south of the Island, through Glenmore and along the shores of Loch Scridain to Fionnphort, where you leave

the coach and board the ferry to Iona. Approximately two hours are spent in Iona, which allows time for a leisurely stroll through the Benedictine Nunnery and the Reilig Oran – the burial place of Kings - on the route to the Abbey.

Day 5 Today we have a half day excursion to a beautiful corner of Argyll not far south of Oban and cross over the only 'Bridge over the Atlantic' to Easdale and Seil Island. An excellent folk museum relates the history of the area, in particular the famous slate quarrying undertaken there. Visitors may also recognize Easdale village, as it was the location used to film the movie 'Ring of Bright Water'. The afternoon is at leisure in Oban, to relax or find a souvenir to remind you of your stay.

Day 6 We depart Oban and travel to our overnight half board accommodation.

Day 7 Complete the journey home to South Wales.
